A Note From Tammy Sutton, Newtown Township, Tax Collector

Just a few reminders to Newtown Township Taxpayers.

The new tax year has begun, and the first Real Estate Tax Bills were issued March 1, 2026. This is the County & Municipal Real Estate Tax bill. If you do not receive your bill, please contact this office. The Tax Collector has no authority to extend due dates or waive penalties, even if you didn't get your bill. The due date to obtain the 2% discount is, as always, April 30th. The due date to avoid penalty is, as always, June 30th.

The 2026 School R/E tax bill AND the 2026 Occupation Tax bill will be issued July 1, 2026

If you have unpaid Real Estate tax bills from 2025 or before, you must contact and or pay your bill to the Bucks County Tax Claim Bureau at the Bucks County Court House in Doylestown for an unpaid COUNTY & MUNICIPAL R/E bill. Their contact number is

215-348-6274. For unpaid 2025 or before SCHOOL Real Estate Tax bills you must contact Council Rock's delinquent collector. Portnoff Law Assoc. 866-211-9466.

If you wish to make a payment in person and you cannot get here during business hours, you may drop your payment in the drop box outside the Township Administration building. For online payments, please visit our website www.newtowntownshiptaxoffice.com. We use a third party servicer for e-check and credit card payments. You may pay by credit card or e-check. There is a convenience fee for this service which is outlined when you make your payment. This information is also available on the back of your tax bill.

If you need to make a change to your occupational status or report a change in residency related to your Occupation Tax bill, please contact Council Rock School District Tax Office to report your change 215-944-1090 or email taxoffice@crsd.org

Keystone Collections Group is the collector of the 1% EIT Tax. Payments must be made directly to Keystone Collections Group. You can contact them to find the locations where payments can be made if you wish to pay in person or if you have questions regarding that tax. 724-978-0300 or www.keystonecollects.com.

The fee schedule is approved annually by the Board of Supervisors. Those residing in Newtown Township are residents, those outside the township are considered non. Many neighbors may have a Newtown mailing address, but they reside in a different township, like Wrightstown or Upper Makefield, even Newtown Borough. Retirements



After dedicating over 28 years of service to the Newtown Township Police Department, Sgt. Robert Lupinetti retired on December 31, 2025.

Robert Lupinetti began his career with the Newtown Township Police Department when Chief Duffy hired him on April 25, 1997. He was promoted to Corporal on January 11, 2012, and promoted to Sergeant on November 13, 2013.

Throughout his career, Robert Lupinetti endlessly contributed to the betterment of the police department. He served as our Accreditation Manager, ensuring that the department achieved and demonstrated the highest acknowledged standards and best practices. He was also the Field Training Coordinator, overseeing all newly hired officers and our field training program to ensure a high level of competence and to enhance our department's performance. Further, he was a champion of community policing. This was especially evident in his work with the Youth Aid Panel, a community-oriented program that empowers the community to participate in problem-solving and offers alternative programs of restitution and community service for first-time juvenile offenders. The Panel offers the first-time offender a second chance to avoid a criminal record and helps to make the offender understand the seriousness of his/her actions, as well as the effect their crimes have on their victims and the community as a whole. On November 13, 2025, the Bucks County Youth Aid Panel recognized Lupinetti for his selfless dedication and attention to detail for the program and for keeping the joint Newtown Township, Upper Makefield, and Newtown Borough program so successful.

He was also a member of the department's Awards Board Committee, the South Central Emergency Response Team, the Honor Guard, and the Bike Patrol, and oversaw our social media platforms and outreach. He received two Commendations of Merit, a Commendation for Life Saving, and countless letters of appreciation and recognition from members of the community, the PA House of Representatives, Bucks County Community College, and neighboring police departments. Words often used to describe him were thoughtful, respectful, dedicated, professional, skilled, compassionate, patient, kind, prompt, and humble.

Robert Lupinetti was truly an exemplary member of this department. We appreciate the legacy of his work, thank him for his service, and wish him a long, happy, and healthy retirement.

Keeping Up With Their Screens: A Guide for Parents on Phone & Internet Safety

In today's world, you cannot ignore the role that smartphones and the internet play in our children's lives. While these tools offer incredible opportunities — from learning and creativity to social connection — they also come with real risks. As parents, it's more important than ever to stay engaged, informed, and proactive about our children's digital habits.

Why This Matters Now

- **Ubiquitous smartphone access:** A large majority of teens have smartphones, and preteens are catching up quickly.
- **Data and privacy risks:** Many apps collect detailed personal information. According to experts, some apps use “surveillance economy” tactics — harvesting data like location, birthday, school, and more.
- **Rapid app turnover:** New social platforms keep emerging, and kids may shift from one app to another quickly.
- **Built-in protections exist:** Most devices and apps include tools that can help parents supervise or guide usage — but you have to know where to look.

Real-World Risks to Talk About With Your Child

- **Oversharing & privacy:** Teens may post personal info without fully understanding long-term implications.
- **Stranger interaction:** Even in “safe” chat apps, children can be exposed to people they don't really know.
- **Digital trust vs. surveillance:** There's a fine line between protecting and spying. According to parenting experts, covert or overly strict monitoring can backfire.
- **Security of parental control tools:** Not all monitoring apps are completely safe — some sideloaded or lesser-known parental control apps can introduce privacy risks.

What Parents Can Do *Right Now*

1. Start a conversation

- Ask your child about what apps they use and what they like about them.
- Use “conversation starters” from trusted guides (for example, Internet Matters provides helpful prompts).

2. Use built-in device tools

- Enable parental controls on smartphones: screen time limits, app approval, content filters.
- On both Android and iOS, you can set up family accounts and restrictions.

3. Pick smart third-party tools

- Use well-vetted apps like Canopy, Norton Family, or others that prioritize user privacy while offering meaningful controls.
- Avoid “covert” spying-style apps; instead emphasize transparency and trust with your child.

4. Make a “digital family plan”

- Agree on rules together: screen durations, off-phone times, which apps are allowed, and how to handle new ones.
- Revisit these rules periodically — as your child grows, their needs and responsibilities change.
- The more effective approach tends to be collaborative: parents and teens working together to set boundaries, understand risk, and learn digital responsibility as a team.

5. Stay educated

- Use resources like **Thorn's Platform Cheat Sheet** to understand new apps and safety concerns.
- Keep up with research or news about parental control tools and their risks.

Bottom Line

- **Awareness:** Know which apps your child uses and what their online environment looks like.
- **Communication:** Talk openly about risks, and let your child help set the rules.
- **Tools + boundaries:** Use parental controls wisely, but prioritize trust and transparency.
- **Adapt:** Update your approach as your child grows and their digital habits change.

Vacation Home Checks:

For a number of years The Newtown Township Police Department has provided this service to residents and property owners. While on routine patrol a police officer pays extra attention to your home while you are away. This service can be provided by simply calling the Police Business Office at (215) 579-1000 x398 prior to the departure date and providing the following information:

- Name
- Address of property
- Date you are leaving & when you plan on returning
- Emergency contact information & phone number
- Is the property alarmed?
- Will anyone else be on the property, checking on pets?

In addition to the property check here are some tips to help keep your home secure in your absence:

- Ask a trusted friend to check on the home on a daily basis
- Cancel mail and newspaper deliveries unless you have someone to pick them up on a daily basis to avoid accumulation.
- Use automatic timers for lights both inside and outside the home
- Make sure all doors and windows are secured
- In the summer have someone cut the grass while you are away
- Turn down the ringer on the phone, an unanswered phone will alert someone outside that no one is home

A Message from Newtown Township Emergency Services Department

As we welcome the warmth of spring, Newtown Fire Rescue is here to ensure that our community stays safe, informed, and prepared for the season ahead. With new challenges and opportunities, we've put together some important updates and safety tips to help keep you and your loved ones safe.

Spring Safety Tips: Fire Prevention & Preparedness

As temperatures rise and the outdoors beckon, spring brings both new hazards and opportunities to refresh safety practices. Here are a few key tips to keep in mind as we enter this new season:

Spring cleaning isn't just about freshening up your home; it's also an excellent time to check for fire hazards. Here are a few tasks to add to your checklist:

- Check smoke detectors: Test all smoke and carbon monoxide detectors and replace batteries if needed. If your detectors are older than 10 years, consider replacing them altogether.
- Clean dryer vents: Lint buildup in dryer vents can easily ignite. Be sure to clean both the lint trap and the vent hose.
- Dispose of rags properly: If you use oil-based paints or cleaners, rags soaked in these substances can ignite spontaneously. Store them in a sealed metal container or dispose of them properly.

Outdoor Fire Safety

Warmer weather means more outdoor activities like grilling, campfires, and bonfires. Here's how to do it safely:

- Grill with caution: Always grill outdoors in a well-ventilated area. Keep your grill away from anything that could catch fire, including trees, bushes, and fences.

- Never leave fires unattended: Whether it's a backyard bonfire or a campfire, always stay with the fire and keep a hose or bucket of water nearby. Never leave embers, cinders or hot debris in plastic containers or near any buildings.
- Properly dispose of smoking materials: Make sure that cigarettes and other smoking materials are fully extinguished before disposing of them—never toss them on the ground, especially in dry grass or leaves.
- Mulch
 - Dry conditions: Sun and wind dry mulch out, making it highly combustible.
 - Improper disposal: Cigarettes, fireworks, or even a hot vehicle exhaust can ignite mulch.
 - Heat buildup: Thick mulch layers can trap heat and smolder internally before bursting into flames.
 - Keep mulch moist: Water newly spread mulch regularly, especially during hot, dry weather.
 - Create a safety zone: Maintain at least 18 inches of non-combustible material (like gravel) around buildings, decks, and foundations.
 - Dispose correctly: Never throw cigarette butts or matches into mulch.
 - Spread thin layers: Avoid piling mulch deeper than 2-3 inches.
 - Stay alert: Report smoking or smoldering spots immediately.

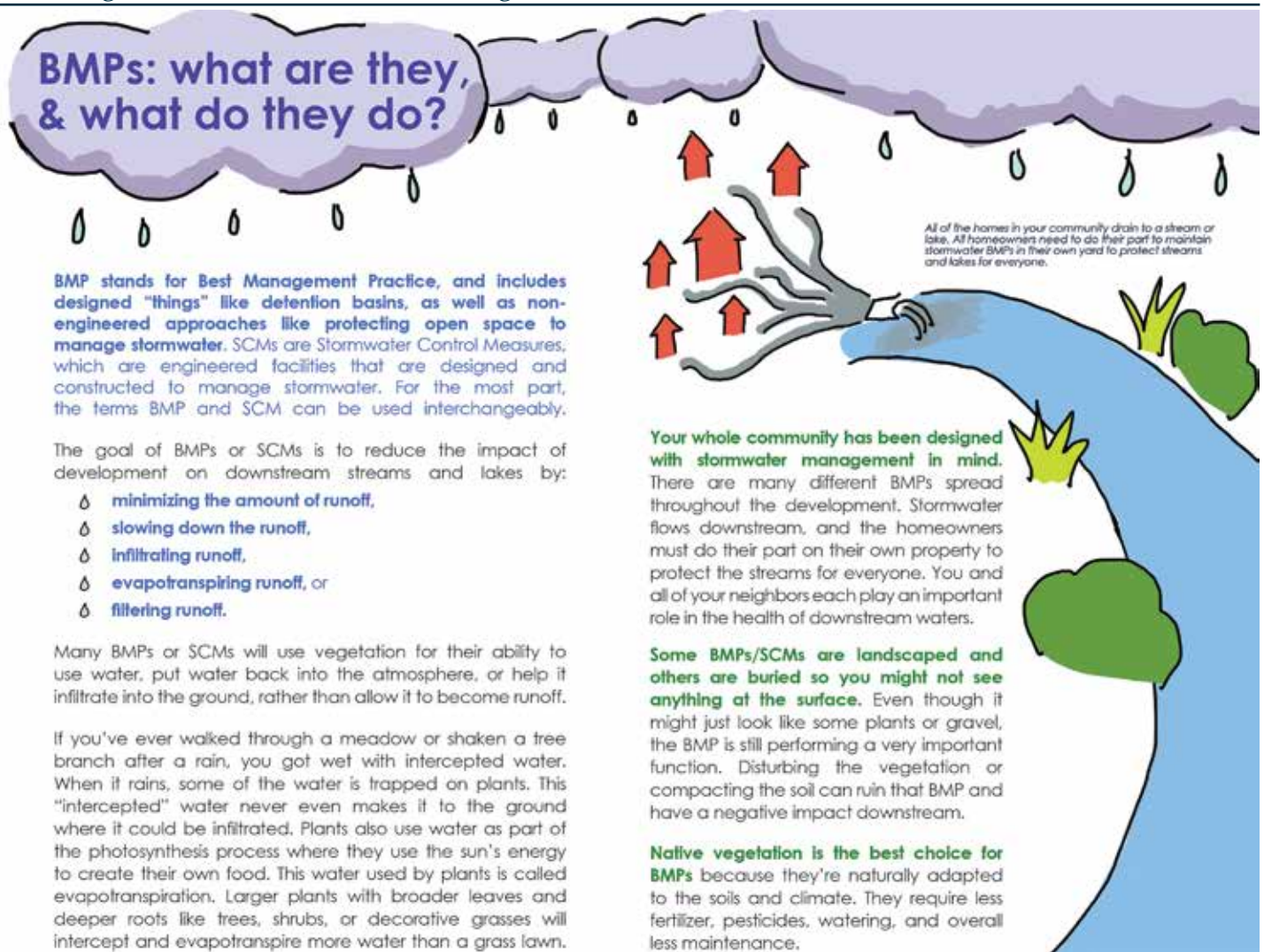

A Message about Stormwater Management

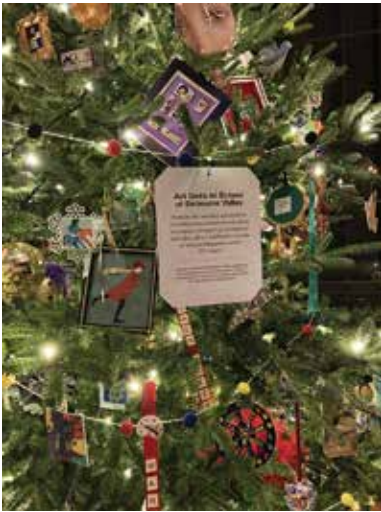

A message from Newtown Township Codes and Zoning Department

Spring is in the air... many people take this time to get started on home improvement projects they've been contemplating. With that in mind, here is some information to help assure that your home improvement project runs smoothly...

- When choosing a contractor, make sure they are registered with the State of Pennsylvania and they provide you their **HIC (Home Improvement Contractor)** number. You can check to see if a contractor is registered by going on the following website: <http://hicsearch.attorneygeneral.gov> It's also a good idea to check with other agencies such as the **Better Business Bureau** and **Department of Consumer Protection** before choosing a contractor.
- If you live in a community with an **HOA (Homeowner's Association)**, please contact your association to check whether the proposed project meets the association's bylaws.
- Make sure all required **approvals and permits** have been secured before you or your contractor begins work. Information and forms can be found on Newtown Township's website www.newtownpa.gov or you can contact the Codes & Zoning Office for assistance.
- If your project requires digging, you or your contractor must contact **PA One Call** (www.pa1call.org or dial 8-1-1) at least 3 to 10 business days before you dig – **IT'S THE LAW**. **PA One Call** will contact the utility companies to mark their lines with paint, flags or stakes. It's important you see marked lines on your property before digging takes place so no accidents occur...keep in mind that careless digging could result in serious personal injury, environmental damage and costly delays.
- Finally, you should always make sure that all of the **proper inspections** are completed including a final inspection before you pay your contractor the remaining balance due upon the job's completion. If you're unsure what inspections have been completed, you can contact the Codes & Zoning Office for this information.

A Message from the Newtown Township Human Relations Commission

Enacted in November 2018, the Newtown Township Anti-Discrimination Ordinance protects people from discrimination in housing, employment, and use of public accommodations or education based on the following actual or perceived characteristics: race, color, national origin, ancestry, gender, religion, age, mental or physical disability, genetic information, sexual orientation, gender identity, gender expression, familial status, marital status or the use of guide or support animals and/or mechanical aids.

The Human Relations Commission (HRC) was established to promote compliance with the Township’s Anti-discrimination Ordinance. The HRC is comprised of 3-5 voting members and up to 3 ex-officio non-voting members, all volunteers, who are appointed by the Township’s Board of Supervisors.

The HRC mediates, investigates and holds hearings on complaints of discrimination in violation of the Township’s Anti-discrimination Ordinance.

If you believe you have been discriminated against in employment, housing or public accommodations, you can file a complaint with the Newtown Township HRC. Complaints can also be filed directly with federal and state agencies such as the U.S. Equal Employment Opportunity Commission (EEOC) or the Pennsylvania Human Relations Commission.

A Complaint may be initiated in person at the Newtown Township Building or by mailing it to the Newtown Township Building or to the Chairperson of the Commission at 100 Municipal Drive, Newtown, PA 18940. All complaints must be received by the Township Manager or by the Commission within 180 days of the alleged act of discrimination to be considered timely.

Conservation Activity in Newtown

SILVER LAKE PARK

Recently, a small group of conservationists quietly gathered in Silver Lake Park to recreate a habitat niche for one of our threatened species. We now know that a widespread drop in wildlife numbers signals a parallel problem in the well being of humans. We need the same clean water, clean air, safe shelters, and food that is free of toxicity. The concept of the “Teflon Man” no longer supports our environmental reality; people have no impervious surfaces to give us special immunities; that metaphor has proven to be a myth. But, protecting natural areas in our parks can help preserve healthful benefits for all.

BALD EAGLE RESTORATION

Beginning in 1983, the Pennsylvania Game Commission implemented a program to recover the Bald Eagle population. Eagle nest numbers across the state that had been reduced to three were gradually reestablished to over 300 under the PGA’s restoration and reintroduction program. Now, Pennsylvania’s bald eagle population has recovered to the point where there are eagle nests documented in all 67 counties.

RECREATING HABITATS

In addition to the importation of young fledgling eagles contributed by Canada, improvements in stream quality and the replanting of streamside trees provided suitable nesting and feeding environments for the eagle population to recover. Eaglets were raised in special towers and then released to establish breeding territories in PA.

Bird Towns in Pennsylvania have now joined the ongoing successful Game Commission program to recover disappearing bird species in Pennsylvania. In Bucks County, there will be at least seven towns installing nesting boxes supported by a grant from the Game Commission in collaboration with Bird Towns. Nest boxes will be installed at no cost if the participating Bird Towns agree to monitor the boxes during the breeding season. As of 2025, there have been 189,000 successful young birds born and fledged due to Game Commission efforts.

RETURNING SONGBIRDS

Due to increased urban development, where normal nesting sites would be a tree cavity or hollow, Prothonotary Warblers have found themselves without places to nest. A small sprightly yellow species, the Prothonotary Warbler migrates from South/Central America in the Spring, searches for a place to have its young near water, then makes the return journey back in the fall to their southern wintering grounds.

This fall two specially customized bird boxes were sited in a wooded area in Silver Lake Park in anticipation that the Prothonotary Warbler will find a new welcoming habitat niche in the Spring. The Game Commission provided an Avian Recovery Biologist who was assisted by the Newtown Bird Town Coordinator, a member of Bucks County Birders, and two Newtown EAC members in installing the boxes. Hopefully, in the Spring we will look forward to finding a new avian denizen setting up housekeeping in Silver Lake Park.

PROTECTING OUR PARKS

Newtown’s Environmental Council as well as our Parks and Recreation Dept. both share the protection of natural resources within the township among their mandates. We have both recreational and natural resource areas within our boundaries. Some parks are designated for “active” organized recreation, others as open space reserved for “passive” activities like nature walks, fishing, a picnic lunch, birdwatching, and the like. Within walking distance is a state park with boating, model solar energy, and programs open to all. If walking is truly what you want to do, why not take a 10 minute walk to their trails? In the not too distant future the Septa Rail Trail will end at our neighboring municipality’s doorstep. There is an embarrassment of riches in the form of accessible parks and trails,

PLANNING FOR THE FUTURE

The Township has spent many a year in concert with two other towns to forge a Joint Comprehensive Plan, including the essential role of natural resources in the vitality of the region. 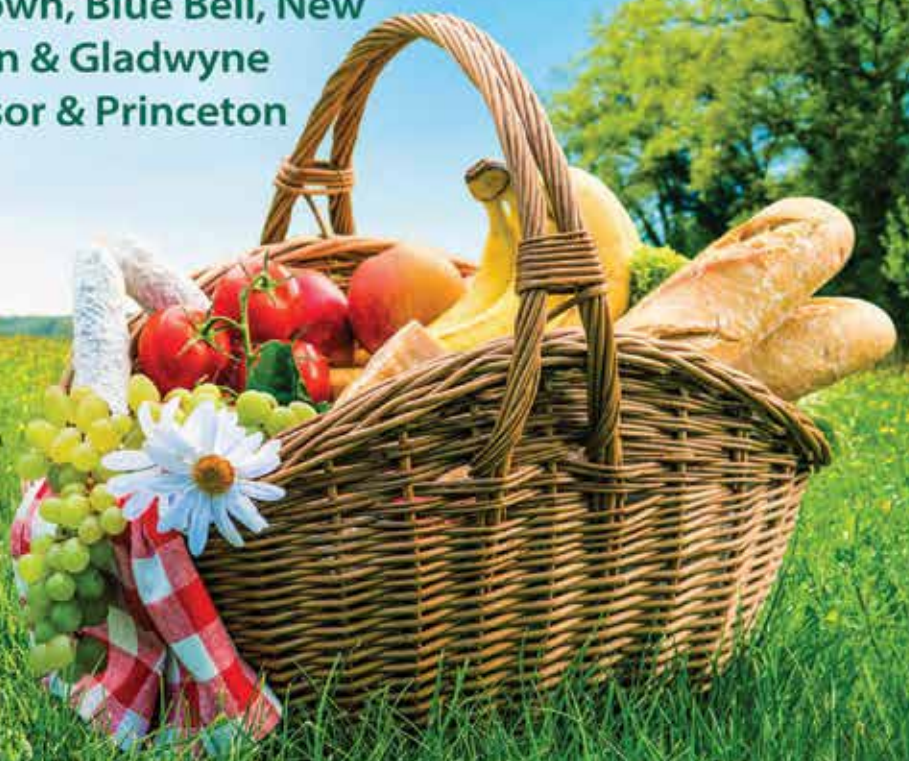
