Just a few reminders to Newtown Township Taxpayers.

The new tax year has begun, and the first Real Estate Tax Bills will be issued March 1, 2027. This is the County & Municipal Real Estate Tax bill. If you do not receive your bill, please contact this office. The Tax Collector has no authority to extend due dates or waive penalties, even if you didn't get your bill. The due date to obtain the 2% discount is, as always, April 30th. The due date to avoid penalty is, as always, June 30th. The 2027 School R/E tax bill AND the 2027 Occupation Tax bill will be issued July 1, 2027.

If you have unpaid Real Estate tax bills from 2025 or before, you must contact and or pay your bill to the Bucks County Tax Claim Bureau at the Bucks County Court House in Doylestown for an unpaid COUNTY & MUNICIPAL R/E bill. Their contact number is 215-348-6274. For unpaid 2025 or before SCHOOL Real Estate Tax bills you must contact Council Rock's

delinquent collector. Portnoff Law Assoc. 866-211-9466.

If you wish to make a payment in person and you cannot get here during business hours, you may drop your payment in the drop box outside the Township Administration building. For Online payments please visit our website www.newtowntownshiptaxoffice.com, or by phone 1-800-300-8007. We use a third party servicer for e-check and credit card payments. You may pay by credit card or e-check. There is a convenience fee for this service which is outlined when you make your payment. This information is also available on the back of your tax bill.

If you need to make a change to your occupational status or report a change in residency related to your Occupation Tax bill, please contact Council Rock School District Tax Office to report your change 215-944-1090.

Keystone Collections Group is the collector of the 1% EIT Tax. Payments must be made directly to Keystone Collections Group. You can contact them to find the locations where payments can be made if you wish to pay in person or if you have questions regarding that tax. 724-978-0300 or www.keystonecollects.com.

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Electric Bikes

Dear Parents,

Before you try to buy your child's love by purchasing them a new electric bicycle (also known as an e-bike), please do your homework!

Unfortunately, these recreational units have caused death and serious injuries to children. Here locally in Newtown, we have received numerous complaints of young e-bike operators disregarding their safety while driving on the roadways and cutting in front of vehicles, of erratic driving on sidewalks in shopping centers, and that many children have no helmets. There is usually no lighting on the e-bike, no turn signals, and they are very silent on their approach and sneak up on unsuspecting motorists, creating a dangerous situation. Help us protect your children....

What is legal?

In PA, an electric bike or e-bike is considered a "pedalcycle with electric assist" and must meet these criteria:

- Rider must be a minimum age of 16;
- Must have operable pedals;
- Electric motor under 750 watts;
- Max speed of 20mph;
- Weigh no more than 100 lbs.

This is an example of an e-bike:



What is NOT Legal?

Regardless of what you call it or the type of tires it has, an e-ride bike, e-ride dirt bike, or e-ride moto bike is mostly advertised and stamped by the manufacturer as "off-road use only." This effectively confirms it is illegal to be operated in public areas such as the roadway, highway, bike lane, sidewalk, or trail. This also applies if the vehicle is gasoline-powered.

Regardless of the rider's age, most of the e-ride bikes or e-dirt bikes do not have the necessary equipment (such as lights, turn signals & mirrors) to meet these requirements, effectively making them illegal to ride on the roadway. The only place where most e-ride bikes can be operated legally is on private property with appropriate permission.

Please educate yourself and your children regarding these types of vehicles to prevent a local tragedy, and ask your children to be respectful of others' properties and rights. Together we can make a safer community.

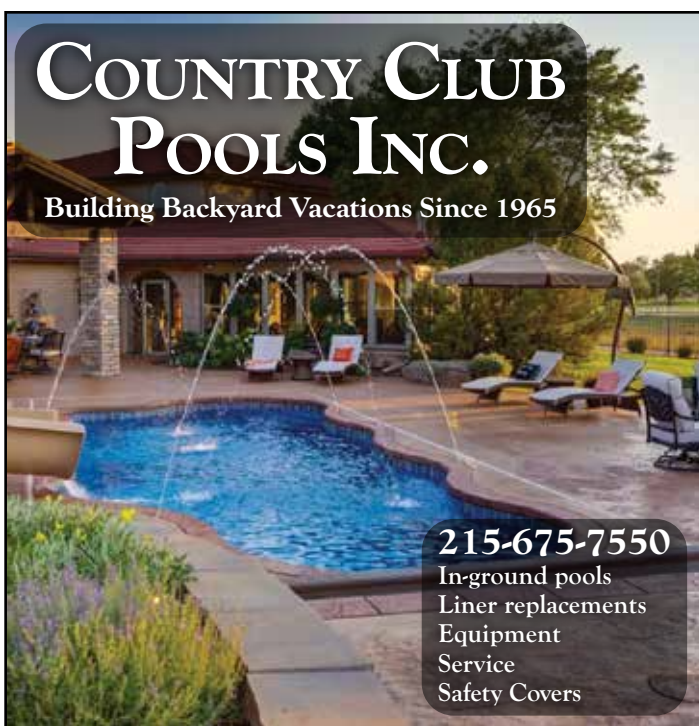


Don't Be a Victim, Lock Your Car!

Often thefts occur overnight from unlocked vehicles. It can happen in commercial parking lots and residential neighborhoods as well. Offenders look for items that are easily carried and resold. GPS units, cell phones, briefcases, purses, sunglasses, and laptop computers are frequently objects of interest to criminals. Keep in mind that these things are not difficult to pawn or sell. We urge you to do these simple things that can drastically reduce your chances of becoming a victim: Don't leave valuables in plain sight in your vehicle. Better yet, don't even leave them in the car. Make sure all of the car's windows are shut. Lock your vehicle, even if it is parked in your own driveway. Lastly, remember to take your keys with you. If you leave your keys in the car, anyone can drive it away.

Keeping Up With Their Screens: A Guide for Parents on Phone & Internet Safety

In today's world, you cannot ignore the role that smartphones and the internet play in our children's lives. While these tools offer incredible opportunities — from learning and creativity to social connection — they also come with real risks. As parents, it's more important than ever to stay engaged, informed, and proactive about our children's digital habits.

Why This Matters Now

- **Ubiquitous smartphone access:** A large majority of teens have smartphones, and preteens are catching up quickly.
- **Data and privacy risks:** Many apps collect detailed personal information. According to experts, some apps use “surveillance economy” tactics — harvesting data like location, birthday, school, and more.
- **Rapid app turnover:** New social platforms keep emerging, and kids may shift from one app to another quickly.
- **Built-in protections exist:** Most devices and apps include tools that can help parents supervise or guide usage — but you have to know where to look.

Real-World Risks to Talk About With Your Child

- **Oversharing & privacy:** Teens may post personal info without fully understanding long-term implications.
- **Stranger interaction:** Even in “safe” chat apps, children can be exposed to people they don't really know.
- **Digital trust vs. surveillance:** There's a fine line between protecting and spying. According to parenting experts, covert or overly strict monitoring can backfire.
- **Security of parental control tools:** Not all monitoring apps are completely safe — some sideloaded or lesser-known parental control apps can introduce privacy risks.

What Parents Can Do Right Now

1. Start a conversation

- Ask your child about what apps they use and what they like about them.
- Use “conversation starters” from trusted guides (for example, Internet Matters provides helpful prompts).

2. Use built-in device tools

- Enable parental controls on smartphones: screen time limits, app approval, content filters.
- On both Android and iOS, you can set up family accounts and restrictions.

3. Pick smart third-party tools

- Use well-vetted apps like Canopy, Norton Family, or others that prioritize user privacy while offering meaningful controls.
- Avoid “covert” spying-style apps; instead emphasize transparency and trust with your child.

4. Make a “digital family plan”

- Agree on rules together: screen durations, off-phone times, which apps are allowed, and how to handle new ones.
- Revisit these rules periodically — as your child grows, their needs and responsibilities change.
- The more effective approach tends to be collaborative: parents and teens working together to set boundaries, understand risk, and learn digital responsibility as a team.

5. Stay educated

- Use resources like **Thorn's Platform Cheat Sheet** to understand new apps and safety concerns.
- Keep up with research or news about parental control tools and their risks.

Bottom Line

- **Awareness:** Know which apps your child uses and what their online environment looks like.
- **Communication:** Talk openly about risks, and let your child help set the rules.
- **Tools + boundaries:** Use parental controls wisely, but prioritize trust and transparency.
- **Adapt:** Update your approach as your child grows and their digital habits change.

The official 2026 theme announced by the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) is “Charge into Fire Safety™: Safe Charging Is a Superpower.” Fire prevention week is held from October 4 - October 10, 2026 and this year’s campaign focuses on the critical habits required to prevent lithium-ion battery fires from rechargeable devices like phones, laptops, e-bikes, and scooters.

For example, use the cord and charger that came with your device or ones approved by the manufacturer. Using the wrong charger can damage the battery and increase the risk of fire. Also, be sure to charge on a hard, flat surface like a table or desk. Beds, couches, and pillows can trap heat and block airflow, which can cause a battery to overheat.

A Message about Stormwater Management

Stormwater runoff is generated when precipitation from rain and snow melt events flow over land and impervious surfaces and does not infiltrate into the ground. The runoff from streets, lawns, farms, and construction and industrial sites pick up fertilizers, dirt, pesticides, oil, grease and many other pollutants and discharge into our lakes, streams and rivers. This untreated discharge is detrimental to our water quality as it can adversely affect our drinking water supply and environment. Many Best Management Practices (BMP’s) such as detention/retention/infiltration basins, are already in place to help keep our water clean.

Winter Deicing Tips for Residents

Excess salt and other deicing chemicals can harm aquatic life in our streams and impact drinking water supplies. This winter, you can help by following these environmentally friendly snow removal practices: • Shovel snow before it turns to ice to limit the need for deicing chemicals like rock salt

- Shovel snow onto permeable surfaces including gently sloping and level landscape and grassy areas so as the snow melts it will soak into the ground rather than flow directly into a nearby storm drain or stream. If you must use deicing chemicals, follow these suggestions...
- Control application of chemical deicers and avoid over application.
- Limit chemical applications near environmentally-sensitive areas including springs, streams, ponds, wetlands, and water supply areas and sensitive landscape and vegetation
- Sand and sawdust can be used as an environmentally-friendly alternative to commonly used salt products.
- Use salt substitutes that are less harmful including Calcium Chloride (CaCl₂) and Calcium Magnesium Acetate (CMA).
- For larger areas, apply salt as a brine solution to prevent drift off of paved surfaces.
- After snowmelt, sweep up residues, including sand, to prevent it from washing into storm drains and streams

Why should I limit my use of salt and other chemical deicing products? Deicing products contain chemical constituents that can be harmful to the environment including water resources and drinking water supplies. For example, sodium can break down soil structure and decrease soil permeability, which adversely impacts vegetation and soil microbes; chloride mobilizes heavy metals and impacts fresh water supplies including ground and surface waters; and heavy metal components can adversely impact water quality, plant and aquatic life.





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A message from Newtown Township Codes and Zoning Department

Schools are back in session this fall and it's important to keep public sidewalks clear for pedestrian use and primarily for the safety and welfare of children who will need to use public sidewalks to travel safely to and from neighborhood bus stops. Therefore, it's important for homeowners to keep tree branches, plants & shrubs trimmed so they do not obstruct use of public sidewalks as per Chapter 25, Section 101, Newtown Township Code of Ordinances, as noted below...

§ 25-101 Tree Trimming.

All trees in Newtown Township shall be kept trimmed so that the minimum clearance where they overhang any public walk shall be nine feet and the minimum clearance where they overhang or project into any public street or highway right-of-way shall be 11 feet. However, the Township is hereby given the right to designate a higher clearance on certain highways, where heavy traffic or other conditions make it expedient.

All trees, plants or shrubs standing on private property and having branches projecting into or over a public highway or right-of-way, shall be kept trimmed by the owner of such private property so that no portion thereof shall extend into or over a sidewalk or right-of-way below the minimum clearance specified above, or such other clearance as may be specified by the Township. In winter months, public sidewalks should be cleared of snow; ice as per Chapter 21, Sections 202 & 203, Newtown Township Code of Ordinances, as noted below...

§ 21-202 Snow Removal from Sidewalks

It shall be the duty of the property owner, not later than 24 hours after snow has ceased to fall, to clear or cause to be cleared a pathway in the sidewalk upon which such property abuts. Such pathway shall not be less than 30 inches in width and shall be thoroughly cleared to that extent of snow or ice or other obstruction. It shall be unlawful for any property owner to allow or permit snow or ice to lie upon or remain upon or piled or accumulated upon a sidewalk within the Township for more than 24 hours.

§ 21-203 Method of Snow and Ice Removal from Sidewalks and Driveways

1. Snow or ice removed from sidewalk areas or driveways shall be placed on the person's property.
2. If there shall be a sufficient amount of snow or ice and there is no longer any place on the Person's property to shovel or remove the snow, then it may be placed along the berm or curb line, but not in the paved street or road.
3. Should the snow and ice on the sidewalk or footpath be frozen so that it cannot be removed without injury to the pavement or damaging the base of the footpath, the person having charge of the ice and snow removal, shall cause the sidewalk abutting or adjacent to such premises to be strewn and to be kept strewn with ashes, sand, or any suitable abrasive material and shall as soon thereafter as the weather shall permit, thoroughly clean such sidewalks.
4. Fire hydrants shall not be covered.

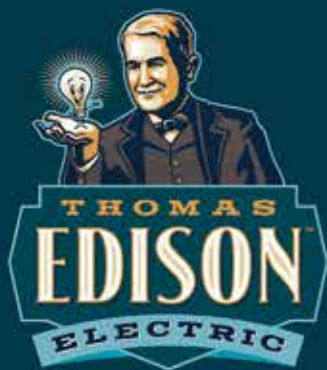

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THE FUTURE OF FRESH WATER

What are riparian buffers and why they are important

CLEANER STREAMS

Riparian buffers are corridors of native plantings that border streams, lakes, ponds, wetlands, or other bodies of water. These plantings act as natural filters since they can effectively remove many pollutants from runoff as well as helping to slow and intercept stormwater. Riparian buffers are among the most cost-effective practices to improve water quality and to create resilient landscapes that support clean water, fish, wildlife, and flood control.

OVERSIGHT

The Federal Clean Water Act provides policy oversight to navigable waters in the fifty states. In turn, regulatory responsibility is transferred to state agencies such as the PADEP (Department of Environmental Protection) and DCNR (Department of Conservation and Natural Resources). In Pennsylvania much responsibility is shared to local municipalities and county Conservation Districts to enact sound initiatives in the way of ordinance protections and conservation measures. Unlike some decisions about separate land parcels, watershed decisions can determine how clean streams will be miles downstream and have regional effects.

TESTING THE WATER

The PADEP has a myriad of tests - biological, chemical, physical and hydrological, that it systematically performs on PA streams. Southeast Pennsylvania, because of the increasing density of land development and industry, is one of the most impacted areas in the state. Newtown Township, is part of the Neshaminy Creek Watershed, and the larger Delaware River system. Since 2022, the Newtown Creek has been deemed “impaired” joining many other streams in adjacent towns.

DITCHING THE ASPHALT

Increased development has added many environmental challenges. There are nearly 86,000 miles of waterways in the Commonwealth and

a large percentage are “impaired”, meaning that they suffer from some aspect of pollution. Impervious surfaces in the form of roofs and asphalt driveways, parking lots and trails are among the major contributors. Installing a paved impervious surface trail adjacent or downhill to a stream negates value in planting streamside buffers. Streamside land disturbance also compacts soil and reduces its stormwater filtration ability. Runoff is what we are trying to mitigate, not create Hard surfaces will increase runoff volume and its velocity, transporting various pollutants with it. Traffic on asphalt trails brings material from worn tires and pet waste. It all adds up.

THE SCIENCE IS CLEAR

Areas covered by native trees, shrubs, and grasses that are located adjacent to and up-gradient from a watercourse can accomplish environmental benefits. Among them are:

- Reducing the transport of sediment, pathogens, chemicals, and pesticides to surface and ground water.
- Improving the quantity and quality of terrestrial and aquatic habitat for wildlife, fish, and other organisms.
- Acting as a carbon sink to reduce atmospheric CO2
- Lowering elevated stream water temperature
- Flood prevention

The width and length of the buffer matter greatly, as well as its connectivity to other buffers. Deeper and longer have better results.

THE RETURN ON INVESTMENT

It is estimated that one acre of forested riparian buffer provides over \$10,000 per year in monetized benefits, such as carbon sequestration, air quality improvement, and flood control. In addition, expect savings in water treatment costs and an increase in property values near areas shaded by tree canopies.

The “Economic Value of Riparian Buffers in the Delaware River Basin” is a report prepared for the Delaware River Keeper Network (a noted non-profit environmental advocacy group) which illustrates the high economic value of streamside buffers. The Riverkeeper report related the story of New York City investing in watershed protection, thereby eliminating the costs of constructing a water filtration plant. They avoided building a plant that would have cost more than four times the amount that was invested in environmental protection, making it a great example that protecting and restoring waterway corridors result in undeniable monetary benefits.

LAWN TO MEADOW CONVERSION

The DEP determination of impaired streams in our Bucks County area means that townships are required to share the load of restoring better stream quality. Newtown and our neighbor towns will need to plant buffers near streams, swales and detention basins. The Township has received a grant from DCNR for installation in some of its public areas. Turf grass has little environmental value and several acres will be replaced with native grasses, wild flowers, and trees according to the topography, soils, and hydrological aspects. There is inevitably some disruption while ecological restoration is in process, but the end result will have long term benefits for environmental economic, and personal health.
